

1. Add „**nur-tamsup.txt**“ at the end of /usr/share/X11/xkb/symbols/in

sudo gedit /usr/share/X11/xkb/symbols/in

in order to open (as administrator) the 'in' layout, and paste the contents of „**nur-tamsup.txt**“ at the end of the 'in' file. Click Save and exit.

2. Register the new 'tamilsup' layout in evdev.xml and base.xml.

Both files have a section that looks like the following. Do a simple search for 'Tamil' or some other string in order to find the segment.

Open base.xml with

sudo gedit /usr/share/X11/xkb/rules/base.xml

Then open evdev.xml with

sudo gedit /usr/share/X11/xkb/rules/evdev.xml

Replace the '-----HERE-----' with the following lines:



What we do here is we insert a variant description for the 'tamilsup' keyboard layout.

Click Save and exit the text edit.

3. Install the font 11ETTamilSup.ttf by clicking at it and opening it by „**Schriften/ writings**“. It will be opened as „**ETTamilSup**“. Then click „**installieren/ install**“.

4. Finally, add the new Tamilsuplement keyboard layout. Go to „**Einstellungen/ settings**“/ „**Region und Sprache/ Region and Language**“. At „**Eingabequellen/ input sources**“ click at the „+“-Sign, then at „**Eine Eingabequelle hinzufügen/ add an input source**“ click at the „;“-Sign and scroll down until you reach „**Tamilisch (Indien)/ Tamil (India)**“. Click on this and scroll down until you reach „**Tamilsuplement**“. Click on this and on „**Hinzufügen/ Add**“. After having restarted the Computer you‘ll find
